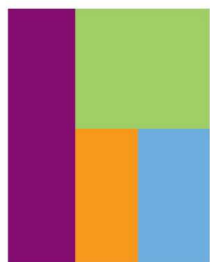

Culture Days Are Here!

Welcome to Culture Days, a nation-wide collaborative movement designed to encourage awareness, participation, and engagement of all Canadians in the arts and cultural life of their communities. This Canadian celebration runs from September 29 to October 2 and represents the largest-ever collective public participation campaign undertaken by the arts and cultural community in this country. During Culture Days, you will enjoy free, hands-on, interactive activities in the "behind the scenes" world of artists, creators, historians, curators, and designers in their community.

Exhibitions, public art projects, performances, author readings, artist talks, film and video screenings, guided tours and hands-on workshops take place at the MacLaren and across the City of Barrie.

Doors Open to Barrie

Come and explore our community – Doors Open Barrie allows you a peek behind-the-scenes of heritage homes, unique businesses, and buildings of interest. Historic walking tours of Barrie's downtown, Union Cemetery, and Allandale neighbourhood will take you on a journey back in time and leave you fascinated with our built and cultural heritage. All events take place Saturday, October 1 and admission is free.
